Students from our school have recently undertaken an education tour of the national capital, Canberra. Students had the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of the Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australia Government provides funding of \$90 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion, and was factored into our excursion budget.
